Rules and Regulations for admission of NRI/PIO/Foreign Students – 2016
(To come into effect from the batch admitted in academic year 2016-17)

1. Preamble

S V University shall open admissions to its regular / Self-Supporting academic programmes for International Students. It is essential to ensure the quality of delivery meeting the international standards at affordable fee structures, Especially, the international students from third world countries would be immensely benefitted.

SV University shall offer academic programmes on self-supporting basis in collaboration with reputed Foreign Universities distributing the period of study in S V University and abroad. The nomenclature of such programmes may be Dual Degree Programmes, Intergrated Programmes and Twinning Programmes. They facilitate the students from India to attain better understanding of the existing knowledge and using that understanding for solving unfamiliar problems and creating new knowledge. For introducing such academic programmes, SV University shall enter into Memorandum of Under standings (MOUs) with reputed Foreign Universities.

2. Categories of International Students

- 2.1 **Non Resident Indian (NRI) as per GO. Ms. No. 47 dated: 19/07/2012, of Govt. of AP. NRI is defined as “Non Resident Indian candidate means a candidate born to a parent on Indian origin residing outside the country and who has passed the qualified examination or its equivalent”**
- 2.2 **“Person of Indian Origin (PIO)”** in this context means a person having foreign citizenship without “NRI” status, who holds a Foreign Passport at the time of sending application, consideration for admission and during the period of his study, and he/she or anyone/both of his/her parents or anyone/both of his grandparents is (or was)/are (or were) citizen (s) of India by virtue of the provisions of the Constitution of Indian or Section2(b) of Citizenship Act, 1955 (Act No. 57 of 1955).
- 2.3 **“Foreign National (FN)”** in this context means an individual having citizenship of a foreign country (citizens of all countries other than India) and not having the status of “NRI” and/or Person of Indian Origin: (PIO).
- 2.4 The candidatures of NRI/PIO/FN shall be sponsored either by the Government of India (GIO) through Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) on cultural exchange programme; sponsored by the concerned home country and / or funding agencies; or directly on self-financing basis with the clearance of (GOI).

3. Programme of Study and Fee Structure

The programmes of study with their respective fee structure are given in Annexure-II

4. Programmes of study and entry qualifications

The programmes of study and their entry qualifications for admission are given below:

Programme	Entry Qualifications
B.Tech	Passed 10+2 (K12) or equivalent examination with Physics, Mathematics and Chemistry as subjects

6. Selection Procedure

- a) For each department, a committee for scrutiny of applications consisting of the Head of the Department (HoD), Chairman, Board of Studies (UG/PG) and a Senior Professor shall be constituted. The committee shall recommend the list of applications eligible for admission after conducting through scrutiny of the application.
- b) There upon, the Director, DOA shall issue a letter of provisional admission to eligible candidates subject to availability of seats with approval of the University.

7. Confirmed Admission

- a) The candidates on receiving the letter of provisional admission shall obtain Student Visa from Indian Consulate / Embassy.
- b) After obtaining student visa, they shall report to the Director, DOA in person with all original certificates and visa for confirming the admission, provided eligibility criteria is satisfied.
- c) On confirmation of admission the prescribed fee shall be paid into a specified account of Andhra Bank / State Bank of India and the evidence of payment shall be produced to the Director, DOA for receiving admission confirmation letter.
- d) However, the University may consider admission of international students, “in absentia”, on the basis of their desire “to be considered in absentia by “International Students Admission Advisory Committee” of University.

8. General

8.1 Medical Test

All the International/NRI students will have to undergo a medical fit including HIV test and COVID-19 test.

8.2 Medical Insurance

It is advised that all Foreign/NRI students take a medical insurance policy to meet the expenses of medical treatments (Which are not available in the university health centre) during their stay at the University. A copy of the said insurance policy should be submitted at the time of final admission.

8.4 Financial Aid/Assistance

University Doesn't Have Any Provision For Scholarships To International Students. However, The Government Of India Grants Some Scholarships Under Various Schemes And Students Are Advised To Contact The Nearest Indian Embassy For Necessary Information About Them. They May Also Peruse The UNESCO Handbook For Study Abroad That Lists Some Scholarships And The Addresses To Which Applications Should be mailed.

They Can Also Apply To The 'Director, Indian Council For Cultural Relations (ISD Section), I.P Estate, New Delhi-110002, India', For Possible Award of scholarship.

8.5 Part-Time Employment:

The University rules do not permit any international student to take up any job part-time or full-time, which being on rolls as a regular student. Detained students, however, can take up some part-time job to sustain their stay with the concurrent permission from the University and the Police Commissioner. While continuing in the job, the student is not supposed to continue studies.

8.6 Indian Customs

Indian customs and practices are different from other countries in many respects and international students are expected to respect them.

8.7 Academic Year

Normally, the academic year of University is scheduled from June to April of every year wherein the entire month May is declared as summer vacation. However, the classwork for this first semester would commence in the first week of August.

- 8.8
- a) Tuition fee is payable per annum.(Annexure-II)
 - b) At time of admission, US\$100 shall be paid towards registration fee.
 - c) Further, an examination fee as prescribed by University shall be paid at the time of admission.
 - d) US\$75 towards Medical insurance will be charged annually.
 - e) Fee once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances.
 - f) The international students from SAARC countries are eligible for a concession of 30% in tuition fee. Further, such of those students who secured 75% or equivalent CGPA in the qualifying examination shall be considered for grant of a 20% of tuition fee as fellowship not exceeding US\$ 1000 in the first year of study. It shall be considered for extending the fellowship for subsequent years of study provided the CGPA secured in the previous year is at least 7.5. SAARC country students are allowed to pay their fees in Indian Rupees(INR). Other are advised to pay in USD (\$).
 - g) Without the NOC from MHRD, no foreign student is eligible to apply for and get the required; Research Visa; (No need of NOC for UG and PG courses) form the respective Embassy / Consulate of India, which is mandatory for the university in order to admit the student into Ph.D programme.
 - h) The candidates who are seeking admission under international student category are exempted from appearing for the entrance test. Normally, the admissions are made on First-come-First-Serve basis and in case of tie, merit in the qualifying examination is considered for tie breaking.
 - i) Pre-Ph.D. Examination, the syllabus, seminars, thesis submission procedure and evaluation are same as specified in the **Ph.D. Regulations** of Sri Venkateswara University.
 - j) **Hostel Accommodation** separate hostels for boys and girls. Accommodation is subject to availability of the rooms

8.9 Photo copies of the following documents are to be attached along with the application:

1. Recent NRI status certificate of the financial supporter (Parent) issued by the Indian embassy of the respective country under their seal.
2. Employment Certificate of the Parent.
3. Certificate of Relationship between the NRI financial supporter and the candidate issued by the competent authority. (Birth Certificate or Passport of the Candidate).
4. NRE/NRI Bank Account Pass Book of the Financial Supporter. (Last Six Months Statement).
5. Valid India Passport of the NRI Parents (Attested Xerox Copy).
6. Qualifying Mark/Grade sheet and certificate of the qualifying examination (certificate translated version in English) of the candidate.
7. Certificate showing that the candidate has undergone the qualifying school education in English medium.
8. School Transfer Certificate or Migration Certificate.
9. Three Passport Size Photographs.
10. Two attested copies of the marks sheet and certificate of 10+2 (K12) or any equivalent examination (certified translated version in English) (In case of admission into under graduate courses).
11. PIO Card (In case of citizen of Indian origin).
12. Any other relevant certificates.

Note: Attestation of all the certificates shall be done by one of the following:

- a. Indian Embassy at the student's country or
- b. Student's country Mission in India or
- c. Ministry of Education in student's country.
 - To ensure speedy processing of application candidates are instructed to send all the above information as a complete set.
 - As and when the applications are received at Director, Directorate of Admissions, they will be processed for admission and the 'Provisional Admission Letter's will be issued to the student.

9. Academic Rules and Regulations

The academic rules and regulations in vogue for the each programme / course are applicable for international students also.

10. Amendment to Regulations:

Sri Venkateswara University reserves the right to amend these regulations at any time in future without any notice. Further, the interpretation of any clauses of these regulations entirely resets with University.
